DAIRY CATTLE FITTING AND SHOWMANSHIP

STANDARDS FOR JUDGING SHOWMANSHIP:

Show animal to the best advantage at all times. Recognize the conformation faults of the animals and show her to overcome them as best you can.

Control – 20 points – Your animal should be under control at all times.

- (a) Halter of right type, fitting properly and correctly placed at all times.
- (b) Hold head strap close to halter with the strap neatly held in one or both hands.
- (c) Animal should respond quickly to showman's desires.
- (d) Lead and pose animal from the left side or front to give better control at all times.

Leading – 20 points – Lead so your animal looks her best at all times.

- (a) The animal's head should be held high enough for impressive style, attractive carriage and graceful walk.

- (b) Enter the ring leading your animals at a normal walk, Lead around the ring in a clockwise direction.
- (c) Lead from the left side of the animal opposite her head or slightly in front of her head.
- (d) The lead strap should be held close to the halter. The excess lead strap should be held neatly, but naturally, on one or both hands.
- (e) As the judge studies your animals, hold the lead strap close to the halter in your left hand and walk backwards slowly. This allows you to watch the judge and see your animal at the same time, At other times you can hold the lead strap close to the halter in the right hand and walk facing ahead,
- (f) Animals should lead readily and respond quickly.
- (g) Don't crowd other animals or impair the judge's vision of other animals,. Keep the ring large enough so the judge can see all animals well.
- (h) Avoid turning animals too short. Have animal moving straight ahead when pulling into line.

Posing – 20 points – Pose your animal to look her best.

- (a) When posing, stay on the animals left side and stand faced at an angle to her in a position to see the stance of her feet and topline.
- (b) Pose animal with her feet squarely under her. For heifers the hind leg away from the judge should be slightly ahead of her hind leg. For cows the hind leg nearest to the judge should be slightly ahead of the far hind leg.
- (c) Face animal up-grad if possible.
- (d) Neither crowd the exhibitors next to you nor leave enough space for another animal when you are in a side-by-side position.
- (e) Animal may be backed out of line when the judge requests that her placing be changed. Many prefer to lead animal forward and around the end of the line or back through the line, do not lead animal between the judge and an animal he is observing.
- (f) Do most of the showing with the halter lead strap and avoid stepping on the animal's feet to move them. Step animal ahead by a slight pull on the lead strap. Move animal back by exerting pressure on the shoulder point with the right hand as you push back with the halter.
- (g) When the judge is observing the animal, let her stand when posed reasonably well. When the judge is observing the left side, step slightly to the front to offer a better view for the judge.

Showman's Alertness, Attitude, & Knowledge – 20 points

- (a) Quickly recognize the conformation faults of the animal you are leading and show her to overcome them
- (b) Keep an eye on your animal and be aware of the position of the judge at all times. Do not be distracted by persons and things outside of the ring.
- (c) Be natural. Show the animal at all times and not yourself. Overshowing, undue fussing, and maneuvering are objectionable.
- (d) Respond promptly to requests from the judge and officials. Know animal's birthdate and freshening date.
- (e) Be courteous and sportsmanlike at all times.
- (f) Keep showing until class has been placed and judge has given reasons.

Showman – 10 points

Clothes and person should be neat and clean. A white uniform is preferred. The show harness or hat with entry number displayed will be considered part of the uniform and must be displayed while in the show ring.

Animal Cleanliness and Fitting – 10 points

Animal should be clean and dirt-free with hair properly groomed and clipped. The animal should show normal growth and be in proper condition.

- (h) Lambs shown in breeding classes cannot be shown in market classes or vice-versa.
- (i) Market lambs minimum weight is 85 pounds and maximum weight is 140 pounds.

4. Meat goats shall be free of any infections and/or transmittable diseases. A health certificate and proof of all required testing must be provided before the animal enters the fair grounds.
5. All 4H & Youth meat goats should be Boer, Boer X or any acceptable meat goat cross. Males must be castrated and should be de-horned for the safety of the exhibitor.
6. SLICK SHEARING OF 4-H & YOUTH MEAT GOATS IS ENCOURAGED, AT LEAST 5 DAYS BEFORE SHOWING, BUT CANNOT BE DONE AFTER WEIGH-IN.
