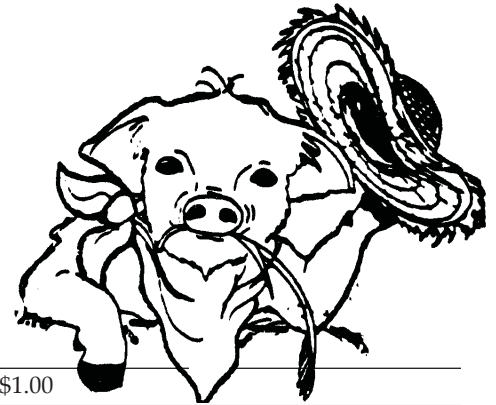

HOW TO ENTER

GENERAL EXHIBITS

- 1) Complete the proper Entry Form(s) located in the center of this handbook (or online) and mail by the date below;
- 2) Pick-up your Entry Tag(s) and attach to your entry (except Livestock);
- 3) Bring your entry to the Fair on Thursday, Aug. 25 between 1:00pm and 8:00pm. Take each entry to the building in which it will be displayed - NO LATE ENTRIES. (Sorry, no exceptions.)

SPECIFIC ENTRY INFORMATION

ENTRY FORM:

Complete ALL information requested. Parents of Youth Exhibitors are encouraged to assist children in completing their entries to include all projects completed or near completion. Locate an accurate description of your entry under the proper Department listing in this Handbook. Record the Department number, Section number, Class number, and the descriptive wording as shown. In many instances, you will want to enter exhibits on anticipated production (ie, flowers, crops, projects near completion, etc) - these types of entries are acceptable and it is understandable if you are not always able to exhibit some of those items and no penalty will be assessed for lack of entry. Be sure to review the **GENERAL RULES** and the **SPECIAL INFORMATION** at the beginning of each Department so that your entry will not be disqualified for any reason.

PRE-REGISTRATION:

Pre-registration is compulsory for all exhibits and must be postmarked or received **THREE (3) WEEKS BEFORE THE START OF THE FAIR - AUGUST 3**. Entry Forms for **Departments 11 - 21** and **Departments 23-24** must be mailed to:

Entrants who wish to receive their tags by mail (instead of picking them up at the fairgrounds) **MUST** pre-register by July 20 and include a \$2.00 check, made payable to GDS Fair, to cover postage and handling.

ENTRY TAGS:

Entry tags will be prepared for each item listed on your Entry Form (except Livestock) and may be picked up at the Main Exhibit Hall on either of the following days. Attach entry tag securely to each item being exhibited.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 20 from 9:00AM until 12:00PM

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 24 from 6:00PM until 8:00PM

ENTRY DROP OFF:

Take each entry to the proper Exhibit Hall and Department in which it is being entered. If you need help locating the proper department, personnel on duty will be glad to provide assistance. Be sure to allow enough time to take your exhibits to the different buildings by the deadlines. We cannot make exceptions to this rule since the Department personnel need the time to arrange exhibits for judging.

DEPARTMENT 22:

Follow the individual entry procedures for each contest in the information provided.

ALL PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE MAILED TO EXHIBITORS AFTER OCTOBER 15TH.

GENERAL RULES

For the convenience of Exhibitors, entries (EXCEPT LIVESTOCK) are received **THURSDAY (8/25) 1:00pm - 8:00pm**. Judging is scheduled to occur on Friday. We ask for your cooperation in using the front parking lot when bringing your entries to the Fair. This will help us to assure your safety and eliminate vehicle congestion on the Fairgrounds.

1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Greene-Dreher-Sterling Fair.
2. The Fair Management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as its judgment may determine.
3. **NO animals will be accepted without Health Certificates.** See additional information under Health Rules for Livestock.
4. Entries must be made according to classification. It shall be the responsibility of the Exhibitor to make known the PROPER NAME of the article or breed of livestock being entered. Any item entered improperly will be disqualified from receiving a prize and the judges will mark the correct name on the entry tag for the benefit of the owner so the same mistake in entering will not be made a second time.
5. All entries must be grown, produced, or made in Pennsylvania since the close of the last Fair and by the Exhibitor only. If the Fair management believes any exhibit was shown previously, that exhibit may be refused or disqualified from judging.
6. Exhibitors may not enter more than one entry for competition in any one class, with the exception of livestock.
7. Premiums, as listed, may be given for exhibits. In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award as they deem the exhibit is worthy to receive. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered. **THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES SHALL BE FINAL IN ALL CASES;** however, any mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion should be reported in writing to the Exhibits Committee as soon as possible for review by the Committee.
8. Department Heads reserve the right to refuse any entry, and to ban from competition, any animals, vegetable, flowers, produce, and manufactured articles of decidedly inferior quality; and those not possessing sufficient merit to warrant recognition.
9. The Fair Management may, at any time, order the removal of any exhibit or part of an exhibit in bad condition, and any article unfit to fit to show may be excluded. Food products cannot be polluted with any substance or chemical that causes them to be poisonous and/or unfit for food.
10. During the judging, buildings (except for livestock areas) are to be closed to everyone except Fair Officials, Judges, Pennsylvania Fair Fund Officials, and necessary attendants. Any exhibitor interfering with the judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which they would otherwise be entitled.
11. After judging, all exhibits will be displayed under the exhibitor's name.
12. Best of Show will be given in Departments 11 - 21 and Departments 23 & 24.
13. No exhibits, except livestock, may be removed at any time before 9:00 AM on Monday, Labor Day. **NO EXCEPTIONS !!** All vegetables, fruits, nuts and baked goods become the property of the Fair. All entries **MUST BE PICKED UP** between 9:00AM and 2:00 pm on Monday, Labor Day. Fair Management will not be responsible for any exhibits not picked up within the specified times.
14. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from injury and damage; but the Fair is not, in any way, to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft, etc, whatever the cause or extent of loss.
15. **ALL CHECKS NOT CASHED WITHIN SIXTY (60) DAYS WILL BE VOID AND CONSIDERED A DONATION TO THE FAIR. PREMIUM CHECKS WILL BE MAILED AFTER OCTOBER 15TH.**
16. In the event the Fair Association does not received sufficient income, for any reason, awards may be reduced.
17. Any Exhibitor may be required to prove the ability to reproduce any entry in any Department in the presence of a qualified person.
18. At the discretion of the barn supervisor (and committee) and due to the availability of department judges, shows may be combined. You would then be informed at entry time of the changes made. If an emergency situation arises and shows must be combined at the last minute, we will do our best to inform and accomodate you at the earliest possible time.

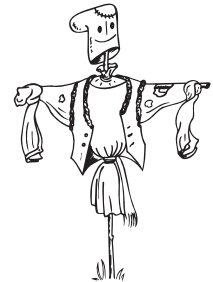

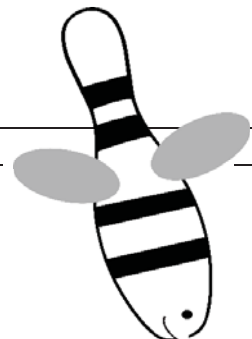

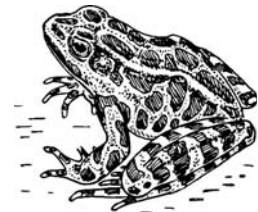

2. Tractors that pull in Antique Pull are not eligible to pull in Farm Tractor Pull.
3. All stock pullers at every event must sign a waiver stating that they understand that they are entering a tractor pulling contest at their own risk and that they will not bring suit against the GDS Fair because of negligence.
4. There is an Entry Fee of \$10.00 per tractor, per class.
5. Tractor may compete in only two classes.
6. Tractor must be a stock block agricultural with no visual engine modifications except air cleaners. No cubic inch limit. Engine must be of original type or factor replacement. All turbo-chargers must be under hood. Original style hood and grill must be in place. No electric fuel pump unless stock factory equipment. Starter and PTO must be in place.
7. All exhaust must A) Discharge upward with a minimum pipe length of 18" from the hood line or use a muffler. If a curved pipe is used, it must discharge forward unless it is stock factory equipped that does not allow it to be turned, B) Be a factory under-slung exhaust system in working condition.
8. Contest open to 2-wheel drive tractors with rubber tires. NO SHARPENED TIRES, dual tires, tired studs or chains permitted.
9. No portion of the tractor or ballast may interfere with sled or sled hitch during a pull.
10. No weight frame or weight may extend more than 24 inches beyond the most forward point of the tractor.
11. All weight frames and weights must be stationary and safely secured to tractor and must not extend rearward beyond rear tires. No weights may be located in a position which could hinder safe operation of the tractor. No ballast on tractor seat and/or deck. No weights or brackets may exceed in width 12" beyond tires. Any ballast or external parts lost while hooked to the sled will be cause for disqualification. No weights or brackets to be closer than 8" to drawbar hook point.
12. The use of torque converters, automatic shifts, etc. will be permitted. No slipper clutches.
13. No turbo-chargers or intercoolers allows unless original factory equipment for that make and model being entered except 11,000; 13,000; and 15,000 will be allowed a 3" turbo. Inside turbo must be stock for make and model of turbo.
14. Drawbar to be stationary in all directions with not more than 1" of movement in any one direction. Maximum height of drawbar for 4,500; 5,500; 7,500; and 9,000 will be 17". Maximum height of drawbar for 11,000; 13,000; and 15,000 will be 20". Length of drawbar to be no less than 24" from center of rear axle. Drawbar must be equipped with a steel hitching device not more than 1" thick and a 3" diameter opening. Cross sectional thickness must be 7/8" minimum. Pulling point may be more than 1 1/2" from back edge of hitching device. PTPA suggests fastening hitching device with one 7/8" to 5/8" grade 5 bolt. No top bracing except complete factory setup. No quick hitch type adapters allowed on tractors. A Clevis may be used for hitching to the sled. Hitches will be inspected for safety.

Stock Diesel – 8,000 lbs – Trucks must be stock. No chips, Boxes, or turners allowed. Trucks must have stock fuel systems, stock turbo and stock air induction system. Tires can be no more than 2 sizes over stock. Must be receiver type hitch mounted in factory position and no more than 26". No lift kits or suspension modification, air bags allowed but must be deflated – they will be checked. If your truck smokes too much or does not appear to be stock, you will be disqualified.

Work Stock Diesel – 8,000 lbs – Trucks must be street legal. Tires must be DOT approved and hitch must be receiver type in factory position and no more than 26" high. No weight boxes or hung weight anywhere on the truck. Trucks may not have suspension lifts or modification and no suspension blocks. Trucks may have air bags, but they must be deflated – they will be checked. Trucks must use stock frames, sheet metal and turbos. No nitrous, propane or water meth injection will be permitted.

Super Street Diesel – 8,000 lbs – Trucks do not have to be street legal. All trucks must have DOT approved tires. Hitch cannot be more than 26" high and no less than 60" from the center of the rear axle. Trucks must have original truck chassis, transfer case and rear for that model truck. Weight box must not exceed 24" from the center of the grill. Trucks must have at least one driveshaft loop on the rear driveshaft and a fire extinguisher. All drivers must wear a helmet.

Open Diesel – 8,000 lbs – This is an open class for all diesel trucks. Drivers must wear a helmet. All trucks must have driveshaft loops, shields around all visible u-joints, kill switch and fire extinguishers. All safety equipment will be checked. Weight box may not exceed 24" from the center of the rear axle. (Hitches cannot be more than 26" high and no less than 60" from the center of the rear axle.)

DO'S AND DON'TS:

Stock Gas – 7,000 lbs – All trucks must be STOCK. No lift kits or suspension modifications. Tire can be more than 2 sizes over factory. No added weight will be allowed. Hitch height can be no more than 26" high and must be receiver type hitch in factory location.

Work Stock Gas – 6,500 lbs – Trucks must be STREET LEGAL. No weight boxes on front of truck. Hitch must be a receiver type installed in factory location and no more than 26" high. Trucks may be modified suspension, no blocks in suspension, air bags are allowed but must be deflated – they will be checked. Tires must be DOT approved and no open headers.

Super Street Gas – 6,500 lbs – Trucks do not have to be street legal. Weight box must not exceed 24" from the center of the grill. Hitch cannot be more than 26" in height and no less than 60" from the center of the rear axle. Trucks must be corporate type drivetrain, no drop boxes or Rockwell type rears. Trucks must use factory truck frame and body or aftermarket equivalent. No cut or bar tires. Driveshaft loops, kill switches and helmets are required. No blower, turbos, superchargers or nitrous will be allowed.

Mod Gas – 6,500 lbs – Trucks must have all safety equipment – kill switches, driveshaft loops and fire extinguishers. Driver must wear helmet. Trucks are limited to one V8 engine – no turbos, blowers, or superchargers. Hitch height must be 26". Hitches may not be less than 60" from the center of the rear axle and weight box may not exceed 24" from the center of the grill.
